Two for One: Tile Table Runner Twins Course Instructions



In this course you will make Two Table Runners using the tile block from the Sienna Rooftop pattern (found in Hearts & More Rotary Cut Appliqué by Sue Pelland). Discover how to use the Hearts and More templates to simply make this advanced block using fusible appliqué.


Prepare Fabrics for Two Table Runners:

- Appliqué fabrics: (40) 5" squares cut from a variety of coordinated dark fabrics - fused
- Background squares: (80) 5" squares cut from a variety of coordinated light fabrics. (Optional: cut diagonally to make 160 triangles if you want a more scrappy background look like the photo above).

Cut Fused Fabrics:

If you are working by yourself, cut all 40 fused appliqué fabric squares. If you are working as a team, let each person in the team cut 20 fused squares as instructed below:

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One at a time, fold the fused squares (fusible side in) on the diagonal and place on a rotating cutting mat. If you do not have a rotating cutting mat, work on the corner of your table

to cut safely. Using Template D small end, place the straight line ending with an arrow on the raw edges of the fabric square, the 90 degree marking on the fold, and the circle line on the point of the folded pieces.

Cut the curve from the 90 degree mark to zero (the arrow) with a 28mm rotary cutter with a sharp blade. Repeat for the opposite point so you are cutting off the two corners that are diagonally across from each other. Use the center piece for one table runner. The heart-shaped pieces can be used for a second table runner.

Table Runner One - Assemble Blocks:

Place a center piece with the fusible side up on your ironing surface. Place a light triangle right side down with the diagonal lined up from point to point on the center piece. Keep cut edges even. Place a second triangle of a different light fabric in the same manner to make a 5" square. Press the two triangles to the back of the fused fabric center. Turn this over and press from the front.

Stitch the fused edges of the center shape with a buttonhole stitch or other decorative machine stitch. You can chain stitch the blocks with a buttonhole (blanket) stitch.

Lay the blocks out in a 4 x 10 grid. Sew the blocks together into rows pressing the seams open. Sew the horizontal rows to complete the runner. Press seams open. Pressing the seams open will reduce bulk caused by the appliqué.

Finishing:

Layer, baste, and quilt as desired. Square up and bind.

Table Runner Two:

Make another table runner using these heart-shaped pieces by fusing the heart-shaped pieces to opposite corners of (40) 5" light colored squares. Stitch the fused edges with a buttonhole stitch or other decorative machine stitch. Lay the pieces out in a 4 x 10 grid. Sew and finish as indicated above.

Baby Quilt:

Make a baby quilt by using the heart-shaped pieces fused to (40) 5" light colored squares and the dark centers fused to (40) 5" light colored squares. Use the 80 squares in an 8 x 10 arrangement. Many patterns can be made.
